Know Your Air Pollutants

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has designated seven “criteria air pollutants.” For each of these pollutants, EPA has set a National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) to protect human health. The NAAQS set specific limits on the quantity of these pollutants in the outdoor air. Can you connect the full name for each of these pollutants to their scientific abbreviation? Draw a line between each pair.

Carbon Monoxide	NO₂
Lead	Pb
Nitrogen Dioxide	SO₂
Ozone	PM₁₀
Particulate Matter less than 10 micrometers	O₃
Particulate Matter less than 2.5 micrometers	CO
Sulfur Dioxide	PM_{2.5}
